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

New Street Sign Toppers Installed

CHNA has installed double-sided reflective signs above all the street signs in our neighborhood. If you notice any missing or damaged signs, please let a CHNA officer know so we can have them replaced.

Residential Parking Permits

Resident-only hang tags are required on the 5100 and 5200 blocks of Pershing, Milam, and Alcott starting at either 8 or 9 pm. Check signs for exact times. Some streets allow parking Sunday and Monday, but have restricted parking Tuesday-Saturday. These tags may be purchased for \$6.50 from the City of Dallas by filling out an application that can be found at: **http://dallascityhall.com/pdf/VehicleHangtagApplication.pdf**. You may purchase up to 6 tags and they are good for one year. You must have a driver's license with your current address on it, a recent utility bill or lease agreement, and proof of vehicle insurance.

Beware! The city issues parking violation citations almost every night of the week! Also, you could get cited for parking on the wrong side of the street or blocking the sidewalk with your vehicle.

Henderson Median

We are moving forward on the Henderson median. Jessie Zarazaga and Steve Ryba of RYBA land design have done two new drawings for going out to bid: a demo drawing and details. The next steps are to obtain a firm bid from a contractor, raise funds, and submit the drawings to the city for construction approval. The next big issue under discussion is that of partiallane-closure during the process of construction for safety. The costs and difficulties might be reduced if we can plan to have the work done after hours, or working 24 hours for very few days. The days for construction should be chosen with care for all concerned.

Playground Renovation

Parks & Recreation will be finishing up the newly renovated playground at Cochran Park within the month. We are all excited to have the new playground equipment for the children in our neighborhood.

Bonham Elementary is on the DISD chopping block.

Students would be moved to Lee or Milam. Read why and what you can do.

The major argument cited is that small schools are inefficient, cost-wise. However, there is research that shows that small schools make a significant impact on low socio-economic children. When schools are larger than 400 students, principals find it more difficult to govern and to truly know the kids. While one can cite the direct costs of education as being more costly in smaller schools, one needs to look at the indirect costs when children fail. Educationally and fiscally, it is more efficacious to educate students with the basics at an early age than to try to remediate later. That doesn't even factor in those children who graduate but do so at the bottom of the heap. Society costs to under-educated students are huge: the cost of poverty in food stamps, housing subsidies, Medicaid, loss of buying power resulting in the loss of revenue for businesses, and the cost of crime and jails, in which over a huge percentage of the inmates who didn't finish school or did so barely literate.

At Exemplary Bonham (8 consecutive years-only one other DISD neighborhood school shares this honor) last year, 100% of the students passed the Reading TAKS and 96%, the Math. Even more outstanding is their rate of Commended students (students who passed missing no more than 2 questions): Math 59%, Reading 40%. Both far exceed the district and state averages. Lee's Commended rates were in the 30s, and Milam's, the 20s.

Bonham cannot be picked up and moved elsewhere with guarantee that its good work will continue. Bonham is successful for a number of reasons, among which are: its small size allows teachers to know all the children and to be able to mentor them (Bonham teachers regularly mentor students from other grade levels), the fact that the staff is included in the governance of the school (something impossible in a larger school), the collegial atmosphere which encourages teachers to know and work with each other (again, difficult or impossible in larger schools) for the benefit of the kids and which allows children to move from grade to grade with the same high level of expectations, the ability of the staff to personalize education, the high quality of the teachers (research shows this is the number one attribute of successful schools), the outstanding leadership by its principal, Sandra Fernandez, and the support of the parents. All of this is in jeopardy if Bonham closed. It is a given that property values suffer without neighborhood schools, resulting in lower school taxes being collected for the district. Lower taxes for us, but, at a significant educational and societal cost.
