# Neighborhood Trivia

# Benjamin Rush "Ben" Milam. 1788 – 1835

Ben Milam was a leading figure in the Texas Revolution. Milam County was named in his honor. In 1819 he traveled from New Orleans to Mexico to help the Mexican revolutionaries gain their independence from Spain. He was jailed and sentenced to death for his help in the revolution but was pardoned in 1822 by Joel Poinsett, U.S. Commissioner of Observation in Mexico. By 1824, Milam was commissioned a colonel in the Mexican army.

In 1835, Milam met a company of Texas soldiers commanded by George Collinsworth, from whom he learned of the Texas movement for independence. Milam joined them in capturing Goliad and then marched with them to join in the fight to capture San Antonio. On

December 4, 1835, Milam was told that the majority of the Texan army had postponed their plan to seize San Antonio until Winter had passed. He pleaded and was granted permission from the Commander, Edward Burleson, to seek volunteers to storm the city the next morning, convinced that delaying the assault would be a disaster for the cause of independence. Hence the source of Milam's famous plea: Who will go with Ben Milam into San Antonio? 300 volunteered.

The siege started at 3.00am the following morning, with two canons opening fire on the Alamo to distract the Mexican army. On December 7, 1835, Milam was shot in the head by a Mexican rifleman and killed instantly. The Mexican army lost more than 400 soldiers in the ensuing battle. The Texan army lost only 20-30. The siege ended on December 9, 1835 when the Mexican army sent a subordinate to negotiate a truce with Milam's successor – Robert Morris. Morris gave the Mexican army all the supplies he could spare and six days to leave the Alamo.

Milam's grave is in Milam Park, San Antonio. In 1938, a statue of Milam was unveiled outside Cameron County courthouse.

In February 2009, Vickery Place will have once weekly pick up. Unfortunately, once weekly pick up for Cochran Heights has yet to be decided. ## **Bonham School Report**

## James Bonham Elementary

There are good things happening at Bonham! Students enjoy a stellar reputation for academic excellence, having attained the highest ranking awarded by the state, Exemplary, based on its scores on the TAKS assessment. This test, given in early May, tests students' mastery of the curriculum through third grade. A rigorous test, Bonham students have received this ranking for the sixth consecutive year. In

addition, students are awarded individual Commended status if they miss two or fewer items on the math and/or reading assessments. The number of students receiving Commended far outscores Dallas's and the state's average. Other district tests for students in Pre-K, first and second reveal that Bonham students also outscore their district peers.

# A Crisis for our Little School on Henderson

James Bonham Elementary is facing a crisis, and needs help now. It has lost a significant amount of its discretionary budget, a cut of almost 50%. No surprise if you read or listen to the news. Teachers have no budget for supplies and materials—transparencies, dryerase markers, copy paper, the list is long. Who knows when it will be released again and schools' supply budgets opened? In an average year, elementary teachers spend \$1000 of their own money on supplies and materials. This year, that amount could easily double. But, there is a more dangerous result of the budget cuts. Bonham no longer has sufficient funds to conduct Saturday School, to pay teachers for their work on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m., as they have in the past, virtually all year. This, along with focused instruction in all grades is Bonham's main intervention strategy for helping third grade children at risk of not passing the TAKS assessment in May. Is it possible for that success to continue today in these perilous budget shortfall times for all of DISD? Unfortunately, money spells academic success.


## **Bonham Teachers are Hero's**

Remarkable thing has happened. The 4 teachers who have conducted Saturday School for the past 6 years have volunteered to teach without compensation this year! They care about their students continuing to pass the TAKS at the record setting rate that they have in the past, and which improves every year. They are willing to give up their Saturday mornings from now until the first of May so that the children who would otherwise be at-risk of not doing well can be guaranteed to do as adequately as their peers in the past.

Donors can be assured that donations will make a difference, immediately. Any money donated to Boosters that is earmarked for Saturday School will only be used for that program.

Boosters hope to be able to help pay the teachers who are currently conducting Saturday School for third graders who are at-risk of not passing the TAKS assessment in early May. These teachers volunteered after the school's budget was slashed this summer.

There is tremendous pride in this school from the teachers, the administration, parents and children. "It is a privilege to work here. No one wants to leave and people are lined up to work here," a Bonham employee explained. With the current financial crisis in DISD, the fate of Bonham is once again at risk. Strong neighborhood participation and support can help it remain a fixture in our neighborhood. When potential parents are encouraged to buy houses in Cochran Heights because
