Leon Robertson, his husband Jeff and their dog Spek, have lived in the Castle House on Milam for four years. Their home was featured in the Cochran Heights Dilbeck Home Tour.

After 18 years working in retail Leon decided to take a leap and focus on two art projects that are dear to his heart. ARF & Soul and the Junkyard Bird Series. Leon considers himself more of a storyteller artist. All of his art tends to be very whimsical and full of stories.

How did 'ARF & Soul' come to be? ARF & Soul was inspired by my dogs Spek and dearly departed Gus. Like many other "dog people", I often wonder what my dogs are thinking about. In short, it's an illustrated anthology about dogs, love and life. I put dogs in human social situations and I illustrate what their words of wisdom to be to the reader might be. In this book, I give them a voice. I titled it 'ARF & Soul' because the dog is speaking to the reader and revealing some very deep and personal thoughts that most humans have experienced.

After 10 years of working on this book, it was released January 31st just in time for the Year of the Dog in the Chinese calendar. I'm half Taiwanese so it seemed that the timing was right.

What inspires your pen and ink illustrations? A car ride, the shower, dog walks and language are my sources of inspiration. Language inspires me the most. Someone will say a word or phrase and it will trigger an idea. Each illustration is titled after the phrase that inspired them.

Tell me about the hidden messages of love. The word Love is hidden in almost every drawing. It's symbolic because it references how love is all around us and sometimes it's hidden or overlooked.

Tell me how your Junkyard Bird Series came to be. In a way, it is a tribute to our neighborhood. One day I was walking our dogs and I observed a bird pick up a piece of plastic and appear to question what to do with it. Bulk pick-ups, construction debris and human careless are some of the reasons litter or junk end up in our yards, streets and sidewalks. So I thought if a bird could create a home from what it finds...I can create a bird from materials I find. All the materials I use for the birds are from the Cochran Heights neighborhood. Many of the birds are named for streets or the materials that are found in our neighborhood. For example, the piece I'm working on right now the Main Street Arts Festival in Fort Worth is called "The Lee-Shard Cockatoo", because it was created from recent car accident and construction remains that I found on Lee Street.

Over 1200 artists applied to the juried Fort Worth Main Street Art Festival. Leon was one of the 223 artists that were invited to exhibit. The Junkyard Birds will be on exhibit at the Main Street Art Festival in Fort Worth. Booth #344 from April 19-22, 2018. www.mainstreetartsfest.org

The City of Dallas gave us free trees to plant in the parkway strip in front of our houses. They are blooming pink right now in full glory so go take a look! They are native "Redbud" trees. We can plant more this spring and fall if more people want to sign up. The minimum is 10 trees to participate in the City of Dallas citizen forester program. Neighbors agree to plant and mulch and water the trees for one year in exchange for the free trees.
