

Bulk Trash Pick Up is the week of the **third Monday of each month**. This month's pickup is **Sept 17**. Trash is usually picked up by Wednesday but can be earlier. You can set out your bulk trash as early as Thursday evening Sept 13.

Regular trash and recyclable materials (blue bin) are picked up once a week on Fridays. A friendly reminder that trash cans are to be placed no earlier than 24 hours prior to pickup and removed from the curb within 24 hours after pickup.

Bulk Trash Pick-Up Set Out Dates

Thurs. Oct 11 – Sun. Oct 14 Thurs. Nov 15 – Sun. Nov 18 Thurs. Dec 13 – Sun. Dec 16

CHNA Meetings take place quarterly in March, June, September and December.

Membership: Dues of \$20.00 per year per household (Sept 1 - August 31 of the following year). New members wishing to vote, must pay dues by August 31st in order to vote in the September meeting. A Good Neighbor Donation in excess of twenty dollars may also count toward dues.
